## Performance notes:

### General

- Because of the chant-based inspiration and nature of this piece, the opening character indication, “Solemn processional, poco rubato sempre” should truly be taken to heart. The players should move with one another through the natural momenta of each line, utilizing the swingset-like gestures of the harp as a guide.

### Harp

- Damp symbols that occur in the staff directly under a notated pitch (m. 13, for example) indicated that pitches played prior to symbol (excluding the notated pitch directly above the symbol) should be dampened; the notated pitch should ring cleanly and clearly.
- When the damp symbol appears with a letter name inside a box  for example, in m. 2, this indication is to dampen only the string of the letter name indicated. These moments occur most often when only one string is in need of dampening, so it is a relatively quick gesture.
- If the damp symbol appears on the top or bottom of the staff (for example, in m. 14), the melodic line closer to the symbol should be dampened. In the case of m. 14, the moving line written with stems down should be muffled.

### Text:

The text for this work comes from the poem *De Profundis* by Alfred Tennyson. The whole poem is split into two large parts: “The Two Greetings,” and “The Human Cry.” This piece excerpts the second of the texts in “The Two Greetings.”
